IN THE REALMS OF AN INGENUOUS WORLD

Art is mind therapy. It speaks without words, it's a stress reliever, and it can make you smile and bring your mind to a different world. These are only part of the things that art can do to us.

Planning an art exhibition with a fresh, experiential and more exciting display is always inspiring but curating a show that grabs people's attention can be challenging.

Nonetheless, Galeri Prima is committed in promoting and providing a platform for artists; young or senior and established or budding, to showcase their talents and art from all genres. This includes offering the space to autodidact artists.

An autodidact does not mean they can't produce amazing work and be a great artist. Their passion is equally the same as the professional artists.

"Don't think about making art, just get it done. Let everyone else decide if it's good or bad, whether they love it or hate it. While they are deciding, make even more art." Andy Warhol once said.

This is evident when the work of an autodidact artist, Jean-Michel Basquiat, the masterpiece "Untitled", was auctioned for USD\$110.5 million at a Sotheby auction in New York in May 2017.

We ended our 2018 shows with a contemplative and sophisticated exhibition that challenged our mind. Ushering in the 2019 calendar, we kick-start our show with a simple, ingenuous and unsophisticated yet lively display.

Painters participating in this exhibition adopt naïvete as a style. It's a style that is usually, but not exclusively, dictated by inexperience. It rejects conventional expertise in the representation or depiction of real objects and formal knowledge of methods. In short, they are self-taught.

However, the perception that the naïvete is practised by self-taught artists is no longer valid. These days, there are academies for this style. There are more schooled and academic painters who imitate and adopt naïvete to produce their artwork.

Ten young emerging and senior artists - a mixture of self-taught ones, including an autism teenager and fine art background artists - jointly participate in **Ingenious Soul.** They are Ali Akbar Othman; Elly Nor Suria; Ismail Baba; Khairulsani Ismail; Yeanni Koo; Nancy Lua Ching Sing; Lyna Khairi; Artjamila; Widodo Soerono and Zurin Shaari.

Ingenious means (of a person) clever, original, creative and inventive, whereas soul

means the spiritual or immaterial part of a human being or animal, regarded as immortal and emotional or intellectual energy or intensity, especially as revealed in a work of art or an artistic performance.

The exhibition is from 10 to 25 January 2019 at Galeri Prima, divided into genres such as Outsider Art, Primitive Art, Folk Art, Naïve Art and Marginal Art.

Primitive Art is usually simplistic in form and colour, using repetitive and tribal motif and lacking in conventional motifs like chiaroscuro, linear perspective and other types of proportionality.

Folk Art is used to express cultural identity. The works are often instilled with a sense of tradition and community. Folk artists are less concerned with the traditional rules of perspective and proportion that are revered in canonical art history and more focused on expressing their cultural identity.

Marginal Art is close to Art Brut and Outsider artists, both in appearance and directness of expression. These are the artists 'on the margins', that grey area of definition that lies between Outsider Art and normal mainstream art.

Outsider Art is about creating work that is not cognizant of academic traditions or normal artistic criteria. Naïve artists may be consciously ignoring these rules of representation.

In summary, all paintings in **Ingenious Soul** range from true examples of artistic expression free of formality, to those works that are acting in a self-conscious or imitative way to reproduce a look of childlike simplicity.

They used both conventional and unconventional approach to keep pace with the contemporary art scene. The works are pure, sincere and authentic expression of emotion. In short, they paint from their souls.

In the words of Jean Dubuffet - Art is a language, an instrument of knowledge, an instrument of communication.

Enjoy the show and let's appreciate ART!

NAÏVE ART

There is a genre of art that is found in almost every country, hung on the walls of the most famous galleries, and created by some of the most acclaimed and talented artists. I am referring to none other than naïve art! Yet despite so much going on for this blossoming genre, very few actually know what defines a piece of art as 'naïve.'

The term Naïve Art was used for the first time at the turn of the 19th century to describe the painting of Henri Rousseau, a self-taught painter admired by the artistic "avant-garde" of the time, which included geniuses such as Picasso, Matisse and Paul Gauguin, among others.

Naïve Art approaches artistic contexts in a spontaneous way, with total aesthetic and expressive freedom. Its followers define it today as "the art that is free of conventions".

Naïve Art is conceived and produced by artists with no specific academic preparation, and without the "obligation" of having to use elaborate techniques and conventional thematic and chromatic approaches in the work they execute. This does not mean that they do not study and perfect their art, in a self-taught and experimental manner, the development of their works, and certainly does not imply that their quality is inferior. Artistic capacity is an innate gift in human beings, and there are no techniques, rules or dogmas that restrict its quality or withdraw its value, when it truly exists.

HISTORY OF MALAYSIAN NAÏVE ART

In Malaysia, Naïve art is sometimes known as Outsider Art. This particular genre is part of mainstream art. This exhibition documents the artists and their contributions towards enriching the art history of Malaysia.

Today, the term is more of an 'umbrella' for a variety of styles, works and artists. Under this umbrella, we may see 'Contemporary Folk Art', 'Marginal Art', 'Naïve Art', 'Self-Taught Art' or 'Visionary Art'.

There are a few artists in Malaysian art history who are/were in fact naïve artists. This comes about as the definition were not recognised/popular/clear that the label simply does not apply towards the genre their works are represented. Clear examples would be Zulkifli Buyong, Zulkifli Dahlan, among others.

Naïve art is seldom mentioned in the history of Malaysian art since it was only pioneered here in the early Eighties by Yusof Gajah. Their works are seldom the subject of discussion in the history of Malaysian art although artists like Zulkifli Buyong and Zulkifli Dahlan do contribute towards the development of this art genre.

While they are often categorized as non-academic or self- taught, these artists too

produce artworks of distinctive value. In Malaysia, it is only in recent years that works by non-professionally trained, self-taught artists have begun to be shown publicly, usually under the "naïve" label. The Malaysian Naïve Art Showcase 2008 and The 1st Sabah Naïve Art Showcase 2012 are examples.

"Since the history of the development of Naïve Art in Malaysia had just began in the sixties with figures like Zulkifli Buyong and Zulkifli Dahlan (An A- Z Guide to Malaysian Art, Rouge Art, 2012) pioneering the genre, little has been written about this particular subject. Nevertheless artists like Yusof Gajah had played a significant role in making the Naïve art well known to the audience in Malaysia.... that the beginnings of a naïve vocabulary began to manifest itself. It would continue and develop throughout his consequence years back home and his deep involvement" (J.Anu Sunday Star June 28, 1998).

The first Naïve Exhibition made history in 1998 with artists like Yusof Gajah, Zila Zain, Azmi S.H. and Shima producing astonishing naïve works that reflect the Malaysian style. Then came the second show, featuring Adeputra and Mat Dollah, in Appear Innocent in 2001.

The year 2008 saw a breakthrough in the development of Naïve art in Malaysia when The Malaysian Naïve Art Showcase 2008 was held in the Annexe, Central Market, featuring 37 naïve artists.

Then came the Sabahan naïve artists namely Jainal Amambing and Awang Fadilah, who were the forefront of many naïve artists who took part in the second Sabah Naïve Art Exhibition in 2013 after a successful show in 2011.

But naıve artists seemed to shy away since then although Naıve artist like Ismail Baba, Eliza Tajuddin, Ali Akbar Othman, Jainal Amambing, Awang Fadillah still constantly showcased their paintings in various shows and exhibitions.


In 2018, a new batch of young naïve artists collaborated with senior artists in a group exhibition named RONA Merdeka at the Balai Seni Lukis Melaka in August. This is followed by another show, TONAWARNA, held at Masa Gallery in Johor Baharu in November 2018.

From this development, Naïve Art Style artists have been invited to showcase their recent works at Galeri Prima.






Khairulsani Ismail Media Persepsi Bikin Bingung Kepala • Watercolour on paper • 42.5 x 32.5 cm • 2018




Khairulsani Ismail Bangkit Melawan, Itulah Aku • Ink on paper • 42.5 x 32.5 cm • 2018

Anak Gadis Muda dari Jerteh • Acrylic on canvas • 107 x 76 cm • 2016










ArtjamilaFish Mosaic: Wave Series 3,4,5 • Mixed media on canvas • 91.5 x 274.5 cm • 2018
